BACKGROUND

The civil-Military ad hoc Working Group for Nordic CBRNE exercises was established on request by the Haga initiative (cooperation between the Nordic authorities responsible for civil preparedness and rescue service) and the NORDEFECO (Nordic Defence Cooperation) after the directors' meeting October 13, 2021. The respective ministries responsible for of civil preparedness and NORDEFECO cooperation in the Nordic countries have all appointed members to the working group.

The working group consisted of five members from the Haga side (DK, FI, IS, NO, SE) and five members from the NORDEFECO side (DK, FI, IS, NO, SE). Some members have also an appointed deputy/substitute. The working group was led by Icelandic civilian member Elísabet Pálmadóttir and Norwegian military member Espen Jargren.

TASK

The Working Group was to look at the current state of Nordic CBRNE cooperation and exercises and then see if there is a way to develop and plan these activities in a consistent manner from a civil-military perspective, with emphasis on exercises.

The group was tasked to provide a list of existing or planned Nordic exercises, either national or multinational, with potential for enhanced civil-military cooperation in a CBRNE context. The scope of this work is limited to exercises conducted in 2023 or 2024. For the full text of the tasking, see annex A.

WG MEETINGS

After a startup meeting on 16th December 2021, the working group has conducted four work meetings from 18th January to 20th June. All meetings were held online and with participation from all the member countries. In the meetings work method and action points were discussed in the WG and desired output agreed upon. Tasking document and meeting notes are included in annex C.

EXERCISES

12 CBRNE exercises have been identified, see annex B. Five will be discussed in some detail: Three of these exercises are conducted on an annual basis and are well established, with potential for further development: *Toxic Fjord* (Norway), *RECCEX* (Nordic countries) and *Brave Beduin* (Denmark). Two are individual exercises: *Arctic Reihn* (EU, Norway), and *Barents Rescue* (Norway, annual, but with C and R elements planned in 2023).

- *Toxic Fjord 2023/24* has a high potential for civil-military cooperation. It is a naval exercise conducted in Bergen, Norway. Target group include CBRN specialists, firefighters, harbour authorities and environmental authorities.
- *RECCEX 2023/24* has a high potential for civil-military cooperation. First responders from all services can participate. The exercise will be conducted in Finland in 2023. Location for the exercise in 2024 is to be decided.
- *Brave Beduin* is a NATO CBRN warning and reporting exercise conducted in Denmark. The potential for Nordic military participation is high, particularly in light of the current NATO membership applications submitted by Finland and Sweden. Given the scope of the exercise the civil-military cooperation potential is low, although first responders and others may participate if connected to a national warning and reporting cell.

- *Arctic Reihn* (planned for 2022, likely to be postponed to 2023) is a civil multinational nuclear and preparedness EU exercise conducted in Norway. Participants in this full-scale exercise will be all the public counterparts from the countries in the region and some other NATO countries. The potential for participation includes military units with capacity to support radiological search and consequence management, as well as the higher levels on warning and reporting, disaster management and nuclear advice. NB: At the time of finishing this report, the EU decision on whether to postpone or to cancel the Arctic Reihn exercise is pending. If cancelled, a similar exercise will be offered by Norway in 2023, with equal or greater potential for Nordic civil/military cooperation.
- *Barents Rescue* is a multinational disaster management exercise conducted in Norway. Participants are both civil and military units in the region. This is a full-scale exercise which was also scheduled for 2022, but postponed due to the conflict in Ukraine. The coming iteration is planned with chemical and radiological cases. Potential participants could be military and civil units with CR capacity, and again the higher levels of disaster management.

Furthermore, Denmark, Sweden and Finland all conduct national exercises where CBRN is (or could easily be) included, and a potential for first responders from all services to participate has been identified. These exercises are scheduled in time and space, but as of yet assigned to specific units. This working group recommends that they should be closely monitored by the respective Nordic CBRNE-authorities, aiming to utilize them for enhanced CBRNE cooperation.

The working group notes that the planning and preparation for the exercises to be conducted in 2023 and possibly also 2024 is well underway, and that any initiative to join, observe or otherwise interact with any of these exercises should be made as soon as possible to the relevant authorities listed in annex B.

It is also noted that the comprehensive composition of this working group, with representatives from the CBRNE communities on both the civilian side and the military side in all of the Nordic nations, has already contributed greatly to the sharing of knowledge about CBRNE related exercises between the communities.

SUMMARY

The working group has found a range of national and Nordic exercises with significant potential for enhanced CBRNE training, both for military and civilian units on different levels. The largest potential is found on the first responders' level, but higher levels may also benefit from participation with appropriate preparation and planning.

A substantial degree of cooperation between the countries and between the civil-military sides already exist, but there is still more potential to be exploited.

Further work could include the initiation of an annual CBRN exercise coordination and development conference, either in person or digital, or a similar mechanism.

Tasking document for the civil-military ad hoc Working Group for Nordic CBRNE exercises

Background

The civil-military ad hoc Working Group for Nordic CBRNE exercises was established after the decision of Haga (cooperation between the Nordic authorities responsible for civil preparedness and rescue services) and NORDEFECO (Nordic Defence Cooperation) directors' meeting on the 13th of October 2021. The respective ministries of civil preparedness in each Nordic country and NORDEFECO members as nations have all appointed members to the working group.

Task

The Working Group is to look at the current state of Nordic CBRNE cooperation and exercises and see if there is a way to develop and plan these activities in a consistent manner from a civil-military perspective, with emphasis on possible exercises.

The group is expected to provide a list of already existing or planned Nordic exercises, either national or multinational, which have potential for civil-military cooperation in CBRNE context. The exercises will be conducted in 2023-2024.

Reporting

The Working Group is to report their results to Haga and NORDEFECO chairs by 31st of August 2022. The report should consist of the identified exercises possible for civil-military cooperation supplemented by any appropriate information needed about the resources or other preconditions. Haga and NORDEFECO chairs will then analyse the listing and present the conclusions to the Haga-NORDEFECO directors for them to decide on possible further steps.

Resources

The Working Group is led by Elisabet Pálmadóttir, the Icelandic civilian member appointed by Haga, and Espen Jargren, the Norwegian military member appointed by NORDEFECO. The leads are to issue a work plan to the group. Group members are to allocate the needed work time according to the plan. Group members are to use national experts and networks to benefit their work as they see necessary and possible. Use of the working methods (meetings, distant working tools, etc.) are up to the working group to decide.

Possible costs are the responsibility of each participating nation according to national procedures.

1. Consolidation

Each participant gave a short presentation of his/her national CBRNE position and experience.

2. Work method

The proposed work method of web meetings and collecting information in an unclassified, shared online spread sheet was accepted by all nations. Sweden raised the question of how to discuss classified information, should the need arise. It was agreed that all information collected online should remain unclassified, and that the potential need to discuss classified information will be discussed in the group on a case-by-case basis.

3. Output

The task given to the work group was discussed and agreed to be clear by all nations. The output by the work group should be a list of existing or planned Nordic national or multinational exercises with potential

for civil/military cooperation within a CBRNE context, conducted in 2023 or 2024, and delivered no later than 31. Aug 2022.

It was agreed by all nations that in order to meet the August deadline, the work group should aim to finish the report NLT the end of June 2022.

The main focus between the first and the second work group meeting should be information gathering. Each nation should start filling in the spread sheet with exercises according to the task. The level of detail was discussed, and it was suggested that it is kept relatively simple at this stage. Also, it is not deemed necessary to put much effort into sorting or prioritizing exercises for now.

4. Meeting schedule

It was agreed by all nations to keep the suggested meeting schedule of 5. April, 24. May and 20. Jun. If further meetings should be deemed necessary, this will be addressed on a case-by-case basis.

NOTE: As we start identifying exercises and gather information, we may discover that the online spread sheet does not cover all the relevant aspects, or that it could be adjusted for clarity, readability or any other reason. The presentation was well received, and it appears to be a considerably increased interest in CBRN-related matters in general and this WGs output in particular, compared to January this year.

Nationally, the NATO winter exercise Cold Response 2022 is just finished. The Norwegian Defence CBRN School facilitated CBRN training and vignettes for the French-led *Combined*

Joint CBRN Defense Task Force (J-CBRND-TF), which is the strategic CBRN response force in NATO. Some vignettes generated interest from national media, as well as French media. Overall, this has greatly increased the visibility of multinational, civil-military CBRN cooperation.
